Description of the role: Bricklaying

Laying bricks.

Applying or removing mortar with a trowel & pointing the work.

Measuring Before laying bricks, the bricklayer needs to measure the build area to be able to place the first rows of bricks and damp course & must know the brick and block measurements.

Understanding and managing the quantities of material required for the job.

Using tools such as hand tools, brick-cutting machines but also spirit levels and plumb lines to check building alignment.

Installing ties insulation & damp course.

Must be good at working at height as scaffolding and mast climbers are being used
