## Plots A1 & A2



- Plot A1 is a 35-storey building providing 186
  new homes in The Founding (including
  intermediate affordable homes), as well as
  office space and shops and restaurants at
  ground floor level.
- Plot A2 is up to six storeys in height, providing new office space, as well as shops and places for eating and drinking. It will also provide a new Southwark Council Leisure Centre, with an eight lane swimming pool, a learner pool, gym, exercise studios, sports courts, soft play area and a café.

# Site layout and vehicle access

- The haul road, by the former Rotherhithe Police Station, is shared between Plots A1 and A2 and controlled by Alandale Group.
- The entrance to the haul road is on Lower Road. Traffic marshals are located on Lower Road to ensure there is no traffic build up and to ensure safety for all.
- Construction vehicles access the site via the haul road and leave site via Deal Porters Way onto Surrey Quays
  Road. From 21<sup>st</sup> January to 3<sup>rd</sup> February, the haul road will be closed for repair works. During this time, most
  construction vehicles will access and leave the site via Deal Porters Way onto Surrey Quays Road to alleviate
  traffic build up at certain times. There will also be times where vehicles will need to reverse into the haul road
  for to safety reasons.

# **Common working practices**

#### **Standard construction working hours:**

- Monday Friday: 8am 6pm
- Saturday: 8am 2pm (no noisy works before 9am)
- When work outside of standard hours is needed, this will be agreed with Southwark Council and communicated in advance via our website: www.canadawater.co.uk /construction-activity



#### Noise, dust and vibration monitoring and reporting

- In line with industry standards and the Construction
   Management Plans for each development site, environmental
   management is a critical part of how construction works are
   managed.
- Noise, vibration and dust monitoring equipment are installed across the site to continuously monitor levels and ensure that they are within the levels agreed with Southwark Council's environment team.
- The monitors have 'trigger points' which alert the site team if noise, dust or vibration comes close to exceeding the approved maximum levels.
- If a trigger point is reached, relevant works stop as soon as safely practicable. The construction team investigate the source and consider mitigations to reduce the levels and impact on receptors.




# Plot A2 – Current site activity

- Completed work: Basement box, and ground floor slab for swimming pools in the leisure centre
- Building cores completed and temporary propping has now been removed
- Current work: Installation of the steel frame and precast slab continues.
   Scheduled for completion in May. Internal fit out with block work.
- March: concrete topping of the floor slabs begins.
- **Spring:** scaffolding erected for cladding installation.

# Canada Dock – site activity

## Enabling works beginning next month:

- Ground works, earth moving and piling works
- Reducing water level to enable full access

## • Spring 2023:

- Works on southern dockside take place
- Access between The Range and the dock will be temporarily reduced

## • Summer 2023:

- Landscaping begins to provide a basis for varied habitats
- Construction begins on 170m boardwalk

#### Autumn 2023:

- Planting begins to create new wetland
- Water levels begin to increase



**Spring 2024:** Scheduled for completion
